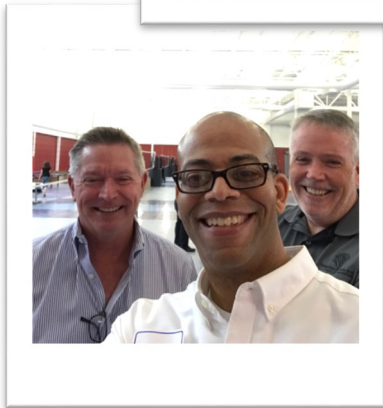

COMMUNITY OPERATIONS RETREAT

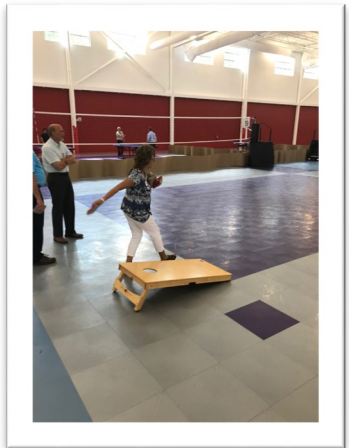
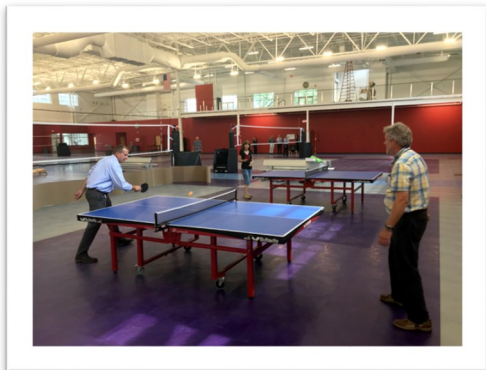
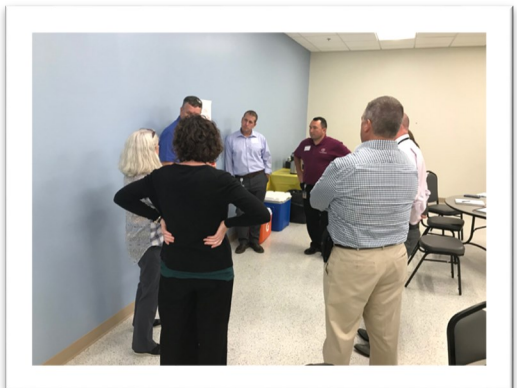
