**Fun in the Sun LIT Program**

The LIT (Leadership-in-Training) program provides an excellent growth experience for teens aged 15-17 who are interested in working with children and have the desire to develop leadership, problem solving and decision-making skills. LITs should have a positive attitude and be reliable, honest, creative, and willing to follow through on all assigned tasks. Participating teens are expected to actively contribute to the program by working with staff in preparing, leading, and conducting a wide variety of recreational activities for the campers. LITs should demonstrate the ability to motivate self, peers, and youth in an enthusiastic manner. Participants will have to submit an essay explaining why they want to participate in the LIT program and give a copy of their most recent report card. Selected participants will receive a certificate of completion at the end of summer camp. All LITs and a parent/guardian will be required to attend an orientation meeting prior to the camp start date. LIT name badges and shirts will be distributed at that time. LITs will be assigned to one of the various summer camp locations.

In our re-created Powhatan settlement of Arrohatock, campers will explore the environment and life of Pocahontas and the culture of the Powhatan people through demonstrations, activities, games, and arts and crafts.
